2nd February 2022 Council Minutes, Quarry Liaison Representative;

There had been a Zoom meeting with the Quarry Liaison Committee and the Graig Quarry Manager; concerns over speeding traffic, overhanging trees on the B5430 between the Old School in Graianrhyd and the junction with the A5104. DCC would be asked to contact all the land owners concerned to cut all trees back; as it is their responsibility. Blasting will be on 24th Feb between 12 noon and 2pm.
- ii. Tarmac planning application to extend the life of the Burley Hill Quarry by 15 years, ongoing. iii. Hannah Parish Senior Minerals & Waste Planning Officer contacted the owners of Maes Y Droell Quarry. They confirmed the site was not for sale and the buildings on the boundary of the site will be removed.

Hannah Parish Senior Minerals & Waste Planning Officer contacted the owners of Maes Y Droell Quarry. They confirmed the site was not for sale and the buildings on the boundary of the site will be removed. Maes Y Droell guarry intend to remove 1000 tons of sand from the guarry, via ten lorry movements in and out per hour on Saturday 12th March to test its quality, from 6am to noon to comply with current planning and guarry working conditions.

- 26th July Council Minutes Quarry Liaison Meeting; Quarry Liaison Meeting; S Jones, A Peter, A Mackridge to attend with Nick Hughes Quarry Supervisor at Graig Quarry, Graianrhyd 4pm 28.7.22. Some items to be discussed are; - speeding wagons, uncovered wagons and a recent dangerous incident between a quarry wagon and local famer with a tractor-trailer unit.

Quarry requested that wagon registration numbers are taken, along with the time and date of incidents; as this will aid the quarry in dealing with complaints and checking the wagon driver's tachographs. The Community Speed Gun Scheme could be used along the Llanarmon Road in Graianrhyd

- 7th September 2022 Council Minutes; S Jones, A Peters will attend Burley Hill Site meeting 1pm 14.9.22 – then report back to full council.
- 5th October Council Minutes; Quarry Liaison Meeting; S Jones, A Peters, Cllr T Mendies attended Burley Hill site meeting 14.9.22. It was agreed that the renewal of the licence would greatly affect the nearest local's property, which had previously been the offices of the quarry and were now holiday homes. The quarry was already there and unfortunately stone for projects had to be guarried where they were found and were in great demand. This was not a new quarry but a renewal of a licence. There was a discussion of the possibility of compensation being paid locally.
